I have a question for us that I think is important. Why does it seem that most people live their lives as though there is no such place as heaven, and yet if they were asked if they believed in a place called Heaven, they would probably answer in the affirmative? And even those of us who claim to have our citizenship in heaven (Phil. 3:20) will often live as though heaven is real but somewhat irrelevant. We are so consumed and impressed by those things around us that the tyranny of the things around us overwhelm our priorities and cause us to neglect the urgent and more eternal things. What is the result? Our lives can be little different from those of our friends for whom the eternal is not important.

So we, along with them, attempt to get all the gusto we can; we experience all the pleasure and prosperity we can; we measure our success by worldly standards; we travel to the most exotic places and eat the best of foods; we seek all the leisure time and creature comforts we can afford. And these experiences become an all-consuming quest: a quest that is illusive and empty at best. And why is that? Because we eventually get to the point of understanding that if there is no eternity, then this life is all there is, there is nothing more. If eternity is not part of life, then life is condensed to a few years of futile seeking of pleasure and fulfilling selfish desires whatever they may be.

So what is the answer? The folks you meet every day need to hear from you that we are created in the image of God and we are built for eternity. We were created for an eternal and unhindered relationship with God and the deep pleasure of His companionship. Then sin entered our lives and caused us to look for physical things to fulfill eternal and spiritual needs. And our physical struggle to find self-worth and importance is simply a feeble attempt to regain what was lost in Eden but will be solved only when we return to where true worth can be found. And that, my friend, is to be found when we get back to our relationship to God through Jesus Christ and eternity and heaven again are placed within our hearts. God's grace needs to break through our obscured view of eternity and show us clearly what lies ahead of us if we are willing to live for him in this fallen

CROSS-CULTURAL MINISTRY

EVEN A KID CAN DO IT! A few days ago, I read an article which strongly challenged me. According to Nick O'Neil in a blog entitled "All Facebook," Logan Ludwing, a 13-year-old kid, created a Facebook Page, which gained 16,000 fans in 96 hours and is increasing at 3,000 fans per day. How could a page reach so many people in such a short time? Let us see what the page is about. Logan found out that his grandfather, a decorated police officer who had served from 19 years, was dying of cancer. The company for which he worked, the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority, had cut his pension from \$3,000.00 a month to \$700.00 a month, so Officer Ludwing had to sell his house, declare bankruptcy, and move in with his son. Logan created a Facebook page to tell this story. It is simply called "Officer Ludwing." As I read this story, I was impressed as I thought of three reasons why this page became so popular.

First of all, it contained a passionate, moving story. We all feel for Office Ludwing. Something deep within us tells us that after 19 years of superb service to the community, he should have not had to face such financial adversity on top of his deteriorating health. This kind of stories moves a lot of people, but is there a more moving story than the Story of Jesus? Is there any other story which can be as compelling? Frankly, I have never heard a more powerful story. But why is it that people do not feel compelled to listen to it, to text about it, or to talk or write about it? Is it that when we tell the story, we ourselves do not feel moved by it? The story of his grandfather was a very personal and moving story for Logan. His passion became contagious, even through computer digits. Have we lost our passion for The Story? Have we become passionate about our religion instead of The Story? Has routine dulled the intensity of the Cross and the Resurrection in our heart which is overwhelmed with worldly cares? I read this blog, and I felt challenged to let myself be totally overcome by the story of the Cross. If I believe in it, I can do nothing less. But the story alone is not the only secret for the success.

Logan was moved enough by the story of his grandfather to take action. He took time to create a Facebook page. Maybe he asked for advice about some of the details. He gathered pictures and videos and composed his digital story. Now he keeps it fresh and up to date. Logan heard a story—the story touched his heart, and he did something about it. Is not this an obvious sequence? If we believe the Story of Jesus, are we not supposed to do something about it? And I am not talking about following His word just on baptism. Once we are baptized because of our faith in the Story, can we really sit in a pew and do nothing about the Cross? The sad picture in our times is that many Christians say they believe the Story, but they are not willing to do anything about it. Therefore, the most compelling Story ever told remains dormant, waiting for a passionate heart to bring it to life. But there is still a third element in Logan's story.

How could a Facebook page reach 16,000 fans in 96 hours? The answer seems to be simple. Each individual touched by the story passed it on. It spread like fire! It spread like the Gospel in the first century. Why do not more people nowadays hear the wonderful Story of Jesus and his Cross? Maybe it is because we do not pass it on. Think about this. Sometimes, we do not really have to do much. We do not have to go to a strange land in a mission field or dedicate several hours to prepare a convincing sermon or cut a big check to support an evangelistic effort. Sometimes, all we have to do is click a button! Why is it that many of us cannot even click it? As I thought about this matter after reading Mr. O'Neil's blog, I felt strongly motivated by the Story of Jesus and His love. May God give us passion, move us into action, and encourage us to pass on His marvelous Story!

Last Sunday, August the 8th, the church in Monte Krystal performed the closing ceremonies for their VBS. There were over 350 people present, and we broadcast the event through our Radio Program.
